STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

As a student involved in Lads to Leaders/Leaderettes, your commitment requires responsibility. A Lads to Leaders/Leaderettes student is responsible for committing the time and effort necessary to master the event(s) in which you participate. This includes, but not limited to, the following tasks:

1. **Read and know the rules of your event thoroughly.** Each event has a specific set of guidelines that must be followed. These rules and guidelines will be provided and can also be obtained from <http://www.lads-to-leaders.org/pdfs/rulebook.pdf>
2. Know who the coordinator(s) of your event(s) are. Do not hesitate to ask questions or seek help.
3. Be attentive to the teaching and training your coordinator will provide.
4. Attend all meetings concerning L2LL and/or your event(s). In the case of a conflict, notify your coordinator and arrange a make-up time.
5. Check the bulletin board regularly for updates and posted lists. Check your name on the lists to be sure you are listed correctly.
6. Meet or beat all deadlines. Your coordinator will keep you informed of important dates. Keep up with your log sheets and other various forms. **It is recommended that daily time is set aside to work on your events!**
7. If at all possible, plan to attend the National Convention in Orlando. If your event is a convention event, attendance is mandatory.
8. Training to be a leader in the church also means striving everyday to more like Christ. Lads to Leaders have 10 Leader pledges that you as a student should know and follow. These pledges are all based on teachings from the Bible. **Learn these and strive to follow.**

Ten Leader Pledges

- 1) I am answerable to God and to society.
 - 2) I will overcome pessimism and live a life of faith in God.
 - 3) I am fully responsible for my behavior.
 - 4) I am responsible for my agreements and obligations.
 - 5) I pursue honest work to meet my responsibilities.
 - 6) I honor and obey my parents and respect persons in authority.
 - 7) I respect my body as the creation of God and use it for His glory.
 - 8) I choose for my friends those who enjoy doing good.
 - 9) I lead in building character and in demonstrating integrity.
 - 10) I lead in second-mile service to others.
